He is now an apprentice at Flahive Brickwork, one of the leading brick sub-contractors in London and the South East.




Supported Learning

Lewisham College offers students with a range of Learning Difficulties and/or Disabilities (LDD) the opportunity to attend College one day per week to help them develop their independence and build on their confidence, communication and personal and social skills.

CASE STUDY JOSIAH RICHARDS

Josiah came to Lewisham College from a local specialist school. He enrolled on the Preparation for Work Café course in Supported Learning, working in the College's own cafe and restaurant alongside gaining work experience in a local coffee shop.

Having built up his confidence and skills, Josiah went on to study Pathways to the Cultural Industries Supported Internship at the British Film Institute.


