Lewisham College won a Double Gold Award for having over 400 students participate in the Reading Ahead Challenge, the highest number of participants in the country. This annual challenge requires participants to read six books of their choice and write a short piece about what was interesting in this piece.

To help encourage students to read during the lockdown, the Learning Centre supported participants by setting up reading groups and adding new material to the student portal, allowing students to discuss the material and talk to teachers about their progress.

Student, Robert Ismael Huerta Velez, said: "Since taking part in this challenge I feel more confident in my English skills which is really helping my progress at Lewisham College. Taking part in the Reading Ahead Challenge introduced me to a new hobby and given me vital skills that will help me to find a job after my qualifications."

Participants attended a virtual celebration to commemorate their achievements with the



College's Vice Principal, Head of Student Services, and the Learning Centre team, where they gave presentations on their reading material and received a certificate of achievement.

Art and Design students showcase their work in an inspiring exhibition

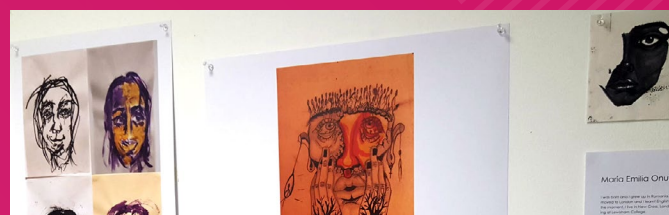
Art and Design students created an exhibition to shine a light on their work, gaining experience of showcasing to the public during the pandemic.

Teacher wins the Mayor of London's Volunteering Award

Maths teacher, Divanio Crooks received the Mayor of London's Volunteering Award on International Volunteer Day 2020 for his work with Southside Young Leaders Academy (SYLA) to support communities during the lockdown. The award recognises the invaluable contribution that volunteers make to creating a safer, stronger and more resilient communities.

Divanio has been part of the teaching staff at Lewisham College for eight years. He volunteers at the academy based in South London to support the charity to help support young boys from Black and Minority Ethnic backgrounds to break down the barriers to education and help reduce the risk of social exclusion through personal development, teamwork and skills training.

He has worked in a variety of roles within the charity and has recently taken over as CEO. During the lockdown months, Divanio was able to implement fundraising, marketing and recruitment strategies and raised £120,000 which was used to transform the programme's delivery model to an online platform, prevent redundancies, deliver monthly food parcels and provide 30 families with laptops.

Commenting on receiving the award, he said: "I am deeply touched to be recognised amongst the hundreds of volunteers and NHS workers that serve and support the public during the pandemic. I had become a volunteer to learn and gain experience for my career development, but I aim to make a difference in the community and inspire young people to achieve their goals."



Asfa Sohail, Principal at Lewisham College, said: "Divanio's hard work and commitment to the College and the community has had positive impact on families and boys in South London, we are very proud of his hard work and to have Divanio as part of our teaching team at Lewisham College."

The charity works with young boys from deprived areas to become socially aware and productive members of their community.

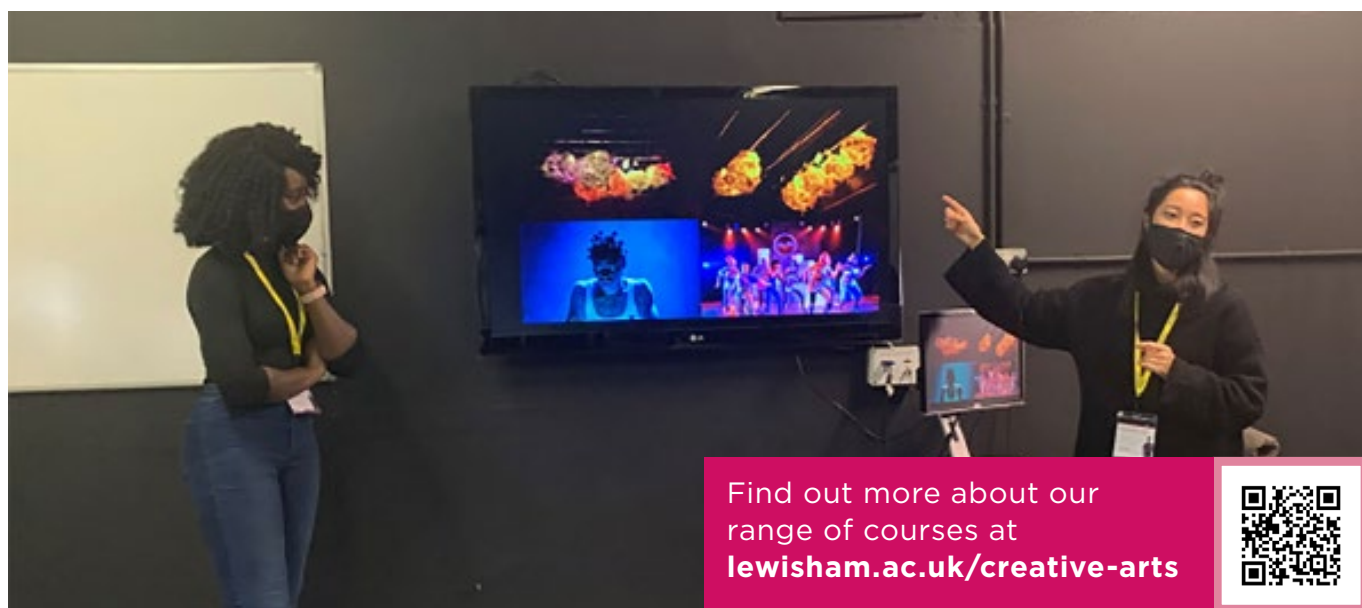

Commenting on her visit, Sylvia said: "It was a pleasure to talk to the students at Lewisham College. In the current climate it is so important that they know what their options are both during and at the end of their studies, and it is beneficial for them to hear from those who have been in their position before."

Following the session, Production Arts student, Reese Maleking, was offered the opportunity to shadow Sylvia during some filming at the Young Vic Theatre. Based on her performance Reese was asked to participate in another project at the Noel Coward Theatre on the set of Dear Evan Hanson.

Reese commented: "This opportunity opened my eyes to the backstage work that goes into a theatre production, how this work is done and how challenging it can be. I enjoy watching productions from the audience's point of view, but having experienced what goes on behind the scenes, I now appreciate the performance even more and I realise that what happens behind the stage can be even more fascinating than the show itself."

New Virtual Creative Workshops

Lewisham College participated in a series of digital workshops hosted by the National Maritime Museum, Queens House and the Know Your Worth support programme.

The workshops have been designed to introduce heritage and historical interpretation career options to creative students. Each workshop included weekly challenges directed by artists and museum professionals encouraging students to use a variety of theatrical techniques.

The project has been spearheaded by Know Your Worth, a support and mentorship programme for young under-represented creatives.

Ian Shillito, Performing and Production Arts lecturer at Lewisham College, said: "I am overjoyed that our students can benefit from this partnership. Lewisham College is determined to give our young creatives the chance to express themselves, encouraging them to consider careers in culture and heritage."

The project was adapted for remote delivery and culminated in a digital showcase to provide an opportunity for students with limited exposure to traditional museum and heritage gallery settings to develop a sense of ownership and belonging, and to link into the wider community.

Chi Onura, Learning Programme Producer at Royal Museums Greenwich, commented: "As a museum, we are directed by our social purpose and relevance. Working with Lewisham College and the Know Your Worth support programme has been a wonderful opportunity to do this. We believe the varied perspectives that young creatives in our local community bring are integral to enriching



the museum's collections, themes and sharing of diverse histories. We are really excited to see the outcomes of the partnership."

Sam Punnett said: "The concept of finding ways our young creatives can re-examine and explore history is key to this project. We encourage them to address those invisible perspectives and present an 'alternative' viewpoint. The outcome is to re-tell stories with a different voice, engage with wider community and make our public spaces accessible for all."

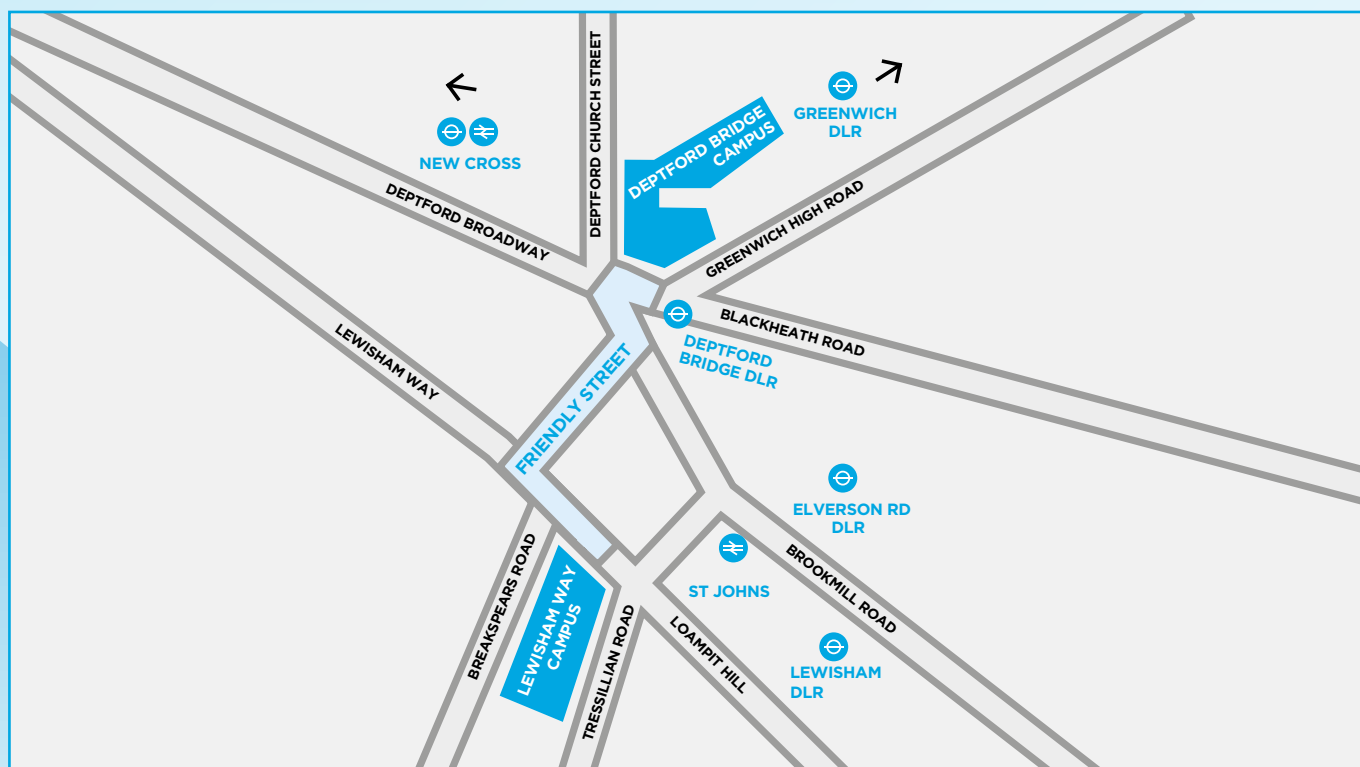
